

NOTES:

- All ECON upper division courses are restricted to declared ECON majors and minors.
- Check Pre-requisites before enrolling.
Prerequisites are strictly enforced.
- ECON 200 is the pre-requisite for all other ECON courses.
- ECON 361 is the pre-requisite for all of the 400 level ECON courses.
- To enroll in ECON 361, you must have ECON 200 (or equivalent) and a **C or better in your Calculus requirement.**
- Since ECON 332 and 361 have Math prerequisites, students should complete the necessary prerequisites early in their program of study. While MATH 113 or 116 are sufficient preparation for ECON 332 or 361, students who have a strong interest in Mathematics or those who wish to pursue graduate study in Economics are encouraged to take MATH 122 A/B or 125.

ECON 400 Level NOTES:

- ECON 478 “Economics of the Natural Environment” does not count as 400 level ECON Elective, but can be counted as part of 15 Upper Division ECON Elective units and part of the 30 units for the major.

INTEREST IN GRADUATE STUDY:

- Students interested in graduate study in Economics should take as many Math course as possible starting with: MATH 129, 215, 223.
- Students interested in graduate study in Economics should also choose courses such as ECON 406, 407, 418, 431, 443, 453, 454 and 481 as elective courses in ECON.

DOUBLE DIPPING

- You cannot double use any ECON course for another requirement. If an ECON course is a requirement in a minor or double major, you will have to take another course to fulfill the requirement. Please work with Advisors to determine appropriate courses.

Example: *Business Administration minors cannot use ECON 200 in the minor. Options to fulfill ECON 200 in the minor are: ACCT 210, taking both BNAD 301 & 304 OR an additional ECON elective (above what is required for the major).*

ECON 300/330/301/331:

- Economics majors cannot take ECON 330 or ECON 331.
- Students who complete ECON 330 or ECON 331 before declaring Economics as a major will still need to take ECON 332. ECON 330 or ECON 331 cannot be used as an Econ upper division elective.
- Economics majors cannot take ECON 300 or ECON 301. ECON 361 should be taken in lieu of 300 or 301. Students who complete ECON 300 or ECON 301 before declaring Economics as a major must take ECON 361. For such students, ECON 300 or ECON 301 will not count towards the major.
- Students should consult with faculty advisors for assistance in selecting elective classes since an optimal choice of electives is contingent on future career plans. All faculty in the Department are involved in advising students. Advising appointments can be scheduled in McClelland 401.

DIFFERENTIAL TUITION:

- ECONBA students are charged a \$900 differential tuition upon enrollment of ECON 332 or 361.

REPEAT POLICY:

- Students are allowed to enroll in a major requirement twice. If a student fails an ECON requirement (ECON 200, 332, 361, etc.) twice, they will either not be allowed to declare ECONBA or will be required to change their major.
